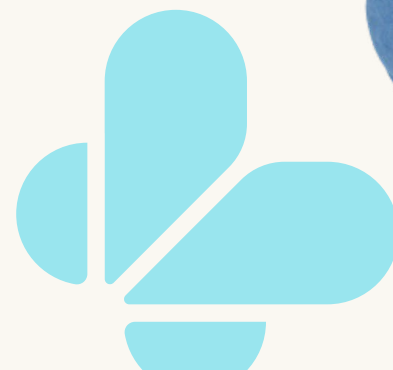

As we reflect on 2025, one thing is clear: the need for UnitedHealthcare Children's Foundation (UHCCF) continues to grow. When families across the country face unexpected medical expenses for the care their children need, UHCCF remains committed to stepping in with support, hope and relief. That need led to a record-breaking 4,146 medical grants awarded in 2025, underscoring the urgency of our mission and the extraordinary generosity of our community.

Since 2005, UHCCF has delivered more than 40,000 medical grants valued at over \$80 million in support to children and families nationwide. Hope happens because of you

Your passion for our mission strengthens our resolve to bring hope in 2026, especially for children like Shiloh and Marina, who are living healthier lives because of you.

Shiloh, TX

Shiloh has needed strength from the start. Born with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and an atrial septal defect, she spent her first month of life in the NICU. After weeks of testing, doctors determined she was in heart failure and would need a heart transplant.

A match was found, and Shiloh received a new heart just months after birth. After surgery, she began recovery through physical, occupational, feeding and speech therapies, plus physical intensive therapy to build mobility. With help from a UHCCF grant, the family was able to cover therapy costs. Shiloh's mom, Cynthia says the support made it possible to continue, and it was "amazing" to see Shiloh progress to walking.

"We want to provide the best life for her so that she can thrive," Shiloh's mom and dad, Cynthia and Eduardo, said. "Never lose hope."

Marina, FL

Marina was born with a partial cleft palate and has endured multiple surgeries and ongoing hearing issues. After Hurricane Ian flooded her family's Fort Myers home, her parents learned she needed hearing aids. The family needed support, and UHCCF provided a grant to relieve their financial strain. When she got the devices, the change was immediate — Marina told her mom, **"I didn't realize the waves made noise."**

"She's doing everything a kid should be doing, and there's no limit to what she can do," Marina's dad, Kevin, said. "It's changed our lives for the better."

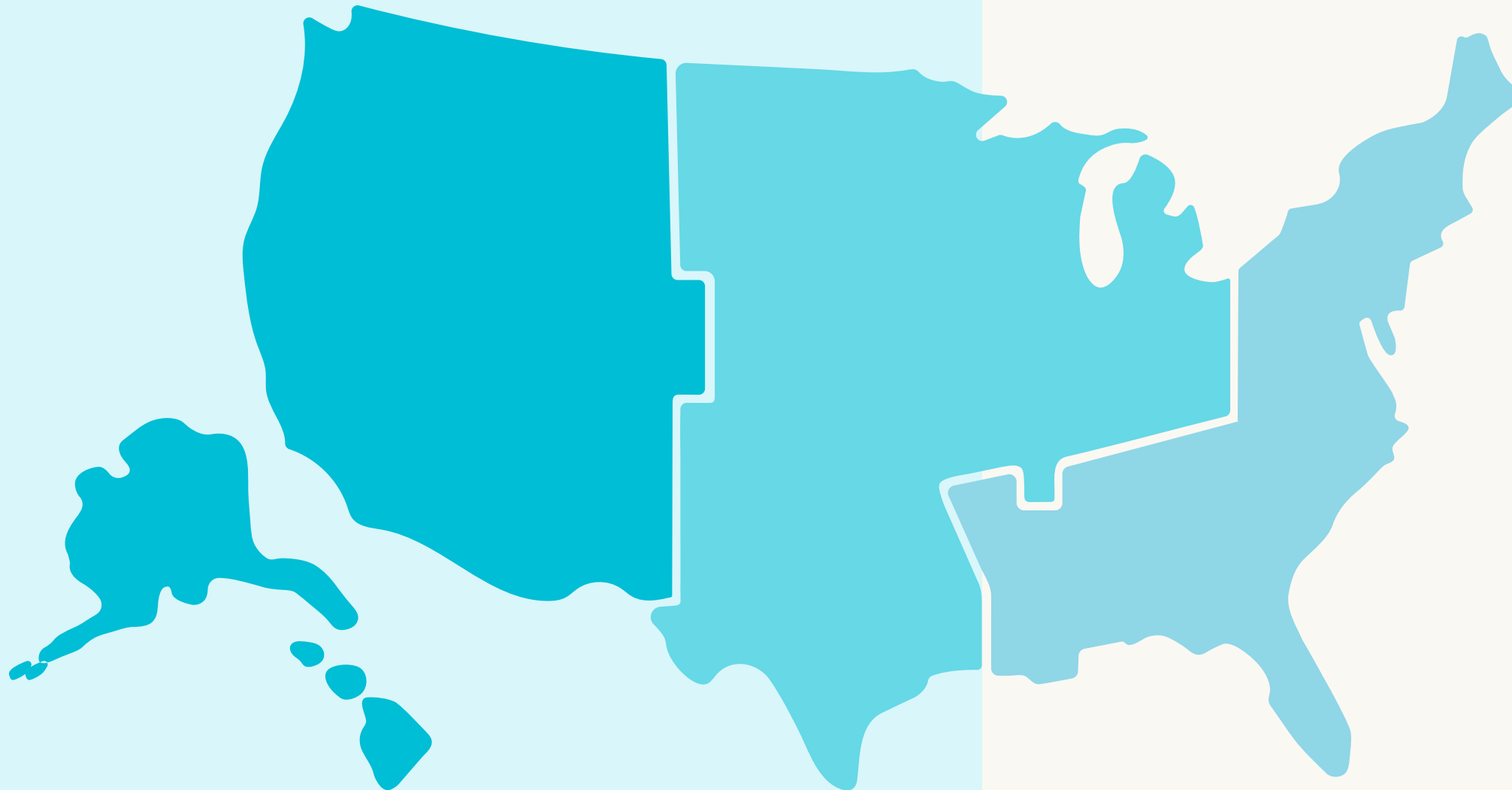

Every grant tells a story

Lily, MN

Lily is a creative 5-year-old who loves to dance, make art and play make-believe, but she has faced frequent, severe illnesses since she was born early. After multiple extended hospital stays, her family learned that she has a rare RUNX1 gene mutation that can make respiratory illnesses more severe for her. UHCCF grants helped ease the financial burden and gave Lily's family hope as they continued her care.

Kaysen, TX

Kaysen was born with Emanuel syndrome, a rare genetic condition that affects his ability to talk, walk and eat, and may also cause seizures, heart abnormalities and kidney issues. With support from UHCCF grants, ongoing occupational, physical and speech therapy is helping him build independence. His parents cherish how far he's come, focusing on what he can do instead of what he can't.

Opal was diagnosed with type 1 diabetes after her dad found the usually-energetic 2-year-old shaking, slurring her words and with blue lips. Over the next year, her family managed appointments and training as she began using a continuous glucose monitor and insulin pump; thanks to UHCCF grants, mounting medical costs were eased, and Opal is full of life with a healthy future ahead.

Jackson & Phoenix, CA

Jackson and Phoenix, brothers from California, are usually hard at play, but their family spent years navigating uncertainty before finding a new normal. After tests confirmed that both boys had significant hearing loss, the brothers were each fitted with hearing aids, and Phoenix received a cochlear implant. UHCCF grants allowed the family to focus on the brothers' rapid improvements in communication and school performance.

Janay, OR



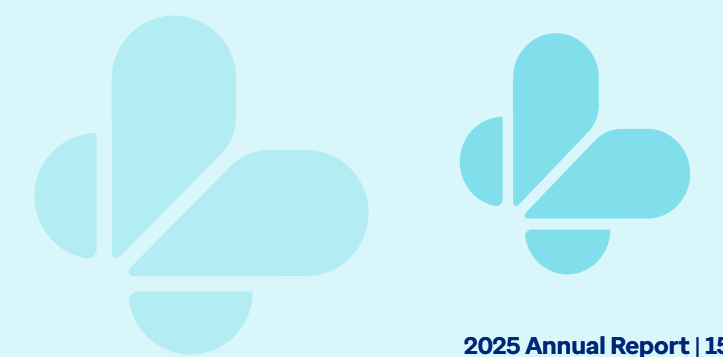
Ever wonder how the kids and grant families we supported in the past are doing? We have an update on Janay and her family from Oregon.

Some moments change a family forever: a diagnosis, an unexpected bill and the sudden realization that love alone can't bridge a gap created by cost. When Janay was found to have mild bilateral hearing loss, her parents did what parents always do. They searched for answers and a way forward. But when insurance wouldn't cover hearing aids, the path felt painfully out of reach.

That's when hope arrived. A grant through UHCCF helped cover the cost of both hearing aids when she was just 2 months old, right when the brain is building the foundations for language and connection. Now 3 years old, she wears her hearing aids consistently and is thriving. She flips through books, dances to music and keeps up with her two older sisters. Most of all, she's confidently communicating in two languages, English and Spanish, which shows what early support can unlock.

Minnesota Fishing Classic

The inaugural Minnesota Fishing Classic made a splash in its first year, raising more than \$530,000 to fund over 360 medical grants. In July, more than 35 boats took to the waters of beautiful Lake Minnetonka, launching from Lord Fletcher's in Spring Park, Minnesota, in pursuit of bass and northern pike. After an exciting day on the water, participants and guests came together for an awards celebration, where the bass tournament winners were announced and the incredible impact of this new signature event was proudly showcased.

Century Ride

More than 100 cyclists gathered in July for the 14th annual Century Ride, which raised over \$800,000 to fund over 540 medical grants. Riders chose their own adventure with the option to select a 100-mile, 50-mile or e-bike route through the rolling hills of the western suburbs of Minneapolis.

Florida Fishing Classic

The 9th annual Florida Fishing Classic was the biggest ever, raising more than \$700,000 to fund over 460 medical grants. In September, 37 boats hit the water from the docks of the beautiful Westin in Cape Coral, Florida in pursuit of snook, redfish and trout. After spending the day on the water, participants and guests enjoyed an award program where we announced the tournament winners and highlighted the event's impact in helping to fund life-changing medical grants for children.

California Golf and Wine Classic

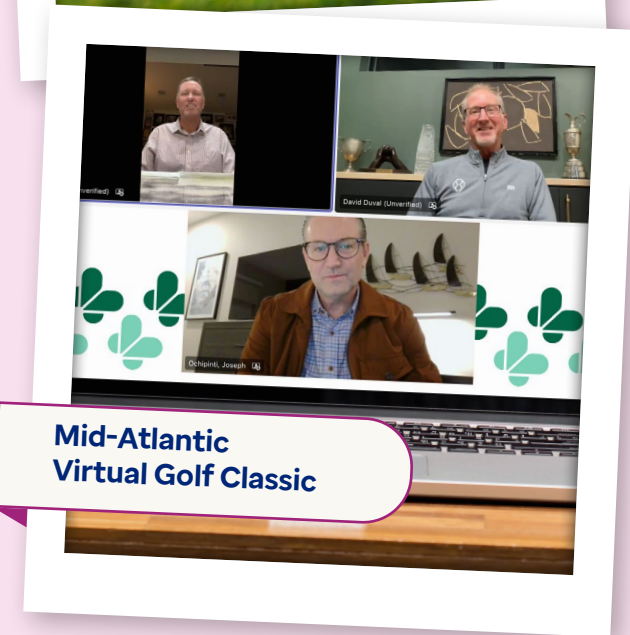

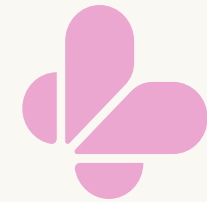

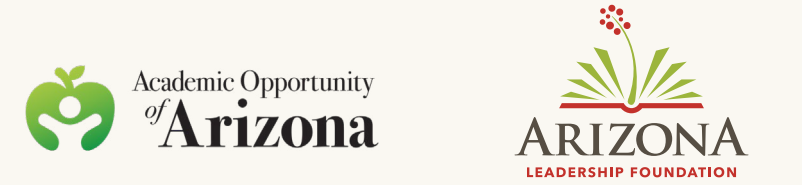

Ambassador program

UHCCF ambassadors made a huge contribution to UHCCF's success in 2025. These UHG employee volunteers are an integral part of promoting fundraising events and awareness. In 2025, we had over 330 ambassadors who stepped up to donate both their time and talent, contributing 950 hours of volunteer time and raising over \$23,000 through event support.

We are so thankful for the UHCCF ambassadors who take time out of their busy lives to support UHCCF during their workdays, evenings, and even weekends.



Grins to Go

Another great year unfolded in 2025 as teams and individuals came together to make double the difference in children's lives. Teams from both UHC and Optum hosted 11 Grins to Go events, assembling 793 Grins to Go bags and donating them to communities across the country. The UHCCF Grins to Go bags include a variety of boredom-busting activities to support a child's imagination. These teams came together and raised over \$35,000 to help provide 23 grants. They spent time developing as a team and brought a smile to nearly 800 children who received the activity bags.



Cuddles to Go

Providing comfort and warmth across the country is the goal of our Cuddles to Go no-sew blanket-tying kit program. We had 20 different internal teams and external organizations tie over 350 blanket kits and donate them to children's hospitals, foster care agencies, homeless shelters, and senior care facilities. These teams raised over \$12,000 to support eight medical grants for children while enjoying a unique networking experience.



Grins²

During the Grins² holiday campaign, generous donors helped spread double the cheer by purchasing a gift from our Grins² online store to send to a child at one of our participating children's hospitals, while also helping to fund a UHCCF medical grant for another child.

From joke books and story books to plush toys, over 2,100 items were donated to children's hospitals across all 50 states. Thanks to everyone who donated items to make children's holidays a little brighter!



Teddy Bear Run

Over 2,760 participants and 200 teams laced up their sneakers and hit the running trails across the country for the fourth annual Teddy Bear Run as part of a movement to help kids and change lives. Runners and walkers virtually logged miles throughout the month of October and raised over \$186,000, which helped fund more than 125 medical grants for children.
